Team USA Aims to Continue Winning Ways in Budapest

The United States has won the outright medal count in the pool in each of the last 11 FINA World Championships contested since 1986 and will look to extend that streak in Budapest. Team USA won 23 total medals in 2015 in Kazan, seven more than runner-up Australia. The U.S. has amassed 441 total medals since the first FINA World Championships in 1973.

Over this span, the U.S. also topped the medal table at the 1988, 1992, 1996, 2000, 2004, 2008, 2012 and 2016 Olympic Games - good for a streak of 19 consecutive major international meets atop the medal table.

Ledecky Looks to Add to World Champs Medal Tally

Over the past two FINA World Championships, **Katie Ledecky** has earned nine gold medals to tie for second on the all-time list, trailing only **Missy Franklin's** 11 gold medals won over the 2011, 2013 and 2015 FINA World Championships. Two years ago in Kazan, Ledecky won five gold medals and earned individual world titles in the 200m, 400m, 800m and 1500m freestyle events. She will look for repeat victories in each of those events in Budapest.

The current world record-holder in the 400m, 800m and 1500m freestyle, Ledecky has posted four world-record swims in FINA World Championships action - the 800m and 1500m free in 2013 and again in 2015.

6th World Champs, 12th Straight Major Event for Beisel

Three-time Olympian **Elizabeth Beisel** is bound for the FINA World Championships for the sixth straight time, dating to 2007. Following a runner-up finish in the 400m IM at Phillips 66 Nationals, Beisel has qualified for 12 straight major long-course international events for Team USA since 2006 - six FINA World Championships, three Olympic Games and three Pan Pacific Championships.

Elite Company for Adrian

With nine career FINA World Championships medals, including five gold, **Nathan Adrian** is poised to enter elite company in Budapest. Only four American men have posted a double-digit medal tally in World Championships action - **Michael Phelps, Ryan Lochte, Aaron Peirsol** and **Matt Biondi**.

Pool Athlete Selection for the 2017 FINA World Championships

A maximum 26 men and 26 women will be selected for the 2017 FINA World Championships using the following criteria:

Priority #1: The top four finishers in the finals of the 100m and 200m freestyle and the winner of each individual Olympic event.

Priority #2: The second-place finisher in each individual Olympic event.

Priority #3: The winner in each non-Olympic event, including the men's 800m free and women's 1500m free for 2017.

Priority #4: The fifth-place finisher in the 100m and 200m free.

Priority #5: The sixth-place finisher in the 100m and 200m free.

If the above priorities result in a list of more than 26 men or 26 women, integrated international rankings will be used for the selection. If all five priorities are used and the result is fewer than 26 men or 26 women, no additional swimmers will be added. **Note:** This is an abbreviated version of the selection criteria. Open Water Athlete Selection for the 2017 FINA World Championships

U.S. open water swimmers were selected from the top finishers in the 10K and 5K races at the 2017 USA Swimming Open Water National Championships on May 19 and 21 at Castaic Lake, California. The top two finishers in the 10K automatically earned a spot to compete in the Olympic-distance 10K race at the FINA World Championships at Lake Balaton, Hungary. The first-place finishers in the men's and women's 5K were selected to swim the 5K at the World Championships. Remaining team vacancies in either the 10K, 5K or 25K were filled by place finish in the 10K at Nationals.
